THE Royal Coachman Lodge is located on the Nuyakuk River in the heart of the world famous Bristol Bay sport fishing region of Southwest Alaska in the 1.6 million acre Wood-Tikchik State Park.

The Bristol Bay region is undoubtedly the premier fishing area of Alaska and has the largest salmon runs in the world.

Nowhere else on earth will you find such a variety of sportfish. The sheer numbers of fish supported by this fishery is incredible. Within the

area we fish, all five species of Pacific salmon; kings, silvers, sockeye, chum and pinks, and seven species of freshwater gamefish including, rainbow trout, dolly varden, arctic char, arctic grayling, northern pike, lake trout, and sheefish, can be caught.

A trip to the Nuyakuk is quite simply whatever you want it to be. There is no pre-scheduled fishing programme. Every day is custom tailored. Each morning, depending on the type of fish you would like to catch, the float plane will fly you out

to that section of the river where the fishing is at its prime. There is also great fishing in front of the lodge and with the Alaskan midnight sun you can fish all night. Schools of spawning salmon congregate in the home pool where grayling rise almost constantly.

Large rainbows and salmon can be caught from the dock. The Nuyakuk River offers exceptional fishing for salmon and trout right in the heart of the most prolific salmon runs in the world.

The Area

The Lodge sits on the banks of the Nuyakuk River, a quarter of a mile downstream from the outlet to Tikchik Lake, nestled in the 1.6 million acre Wood-Tikchik State Park. The park contains 13 lakes that make up two distinct watersheds. The entire northern watershed drains into the Upper Nushagak River via the Nuyakuk River from the outlet of Tikchik Lake.

The Kilbuck Mountains rise majestically from the waters edge where the western end of the lakes probe the mountain range in spectacular fjords. This area of Alaska is accessible only by floatplane. Most Alaskan lodges are located in small towns or native villages, but the Royal Coachman Lodge, 65 air miles north of Dillingham, is totally isolated in the midst of this vast Alaskan wilderness. This is true wilderness fishing at its best.

Royal Coachman Lodge

The lodge caters to a maximum of eight anglers per week, or private groups up to 12, with a camp staff of eight to ten people. This small number of guests and large staff ensures that you will receive exceptional personal service and attention in an intimate setting.

The lodge has four finely furnished guest cottages, with one or two bedrooms, and private baths. It also has two well appointed bedrooms in the main lodge. Each cabin or room has modern bath facilities, independent heat, excellent beds, and spectacular views of the river, the rapids and the majestic mountains. The small capacity of the lodge, the flexibility of the fishing schedule and the experience and hospitality of the crew will ensure that your visit to the Royal Coachman surpasses your highest expectations.

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TRIP DETAILS

Season: **June to September**

Fish Species: **Pacific salmon (all five species), rainbow trout, arctic char, dolly varden, lake trout, grayling, sheefish and northern pike**

Tackle: **A 7 to 11 weight for salmon, 5 to 8 weight for trout and char, 4 to 6 weight for grayling and 8 to 9 weight for pike and sheefish**

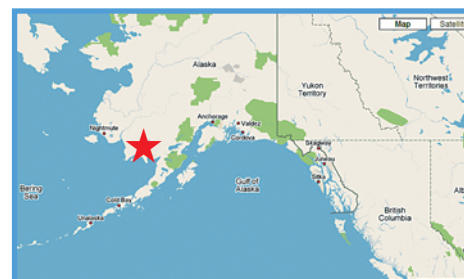
Clothing: **Adopt a layered approach. Good quality rain jacket, fleece and cotton underwear, lightweight waders and felt soled boots. A small rucksack, sunglasses, bug repellent and of course a camera**

Package includes:

- **Seven nights accommodation (based on double occupancy)**
- **Six days guided fly out fishing (usually Sunday to Sunday)**
- **All meals and soft drinks**
- **Round trip floatplane transportation from Dillingham to lodge**
- **All meals, soft drinks, local and state taxes, fishing licenses and fishing flies**

Lodge Capacity: **Eight anglers (private groups up to 12)**
